PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE:

My favorite view was ruined last week. I grew up in Salem and moved my family back there a year ago. Our back patio faces the beautiful Loafer Mountain. I have always loved mountain views, but the fires have altered them so that they won't be the same for many years.

As my boys and I watched the fire progress across the mountains, we saw each tree ignite, burst into flame for a few seconds, and then smolder to a deep red. It was very beautiful, but very sad. What I saw on the mountain resembles many of the initiatives that are popular in education today. A few people are excited about a "new" program, they ignite interest in others, who burst with excitement, and then the excitement fizzles out when students don't progress as expected. This pattern is repeated over and over across the country. It's no wonder there is so much confusion and debate about how to help students succeed.

In contrast, we have found a pattern that successfully helps children to learn: effective lessons and purposeful reading, writing, and dialogue led by caring teachers and parents. That is the kind of education that I see happening at Rock Canyon. This kind of education is long lasting and life changing.

Because we are so committed to ensuring effective lessons and purposeful reading for each student, we have hired Alyce Jayne McKinney as a part-time facilitator. Her job will be to direct the work of identifying and addressing specific reading needs for each student. Alyce Jayne has many years' experience in literacy instruction and helping students succeed – and she used to teach at Rock Canyon!

As we identify specific reading needs, and instruct students in their reading, I feel assured that our students will find more success and confidence in their ability to learn and be successful in school and throughout life. -Seth Hansen, Principal
